• Benzyl Alcohol (and) Salicylic Acid (and) Glycerin (and) Sorbic Acid – A natural blend with broad-spectrum activity. Effective in pH ranges of 3–8.

• Sodium Anisate and Sodium Levulinate – Derived from fennel and corn. Offers a mild, skin-compatible preservation system.

• Caprylyl Glycol (and) Ethylhexylglycerin – Multifunctional, offering both preservation and skin conditioning.

• Aspen Bark Extract – A natural source of salicylates, ideal for preserving low-water or anhydrous products.
